

Steer Shooters Hit Bullseye

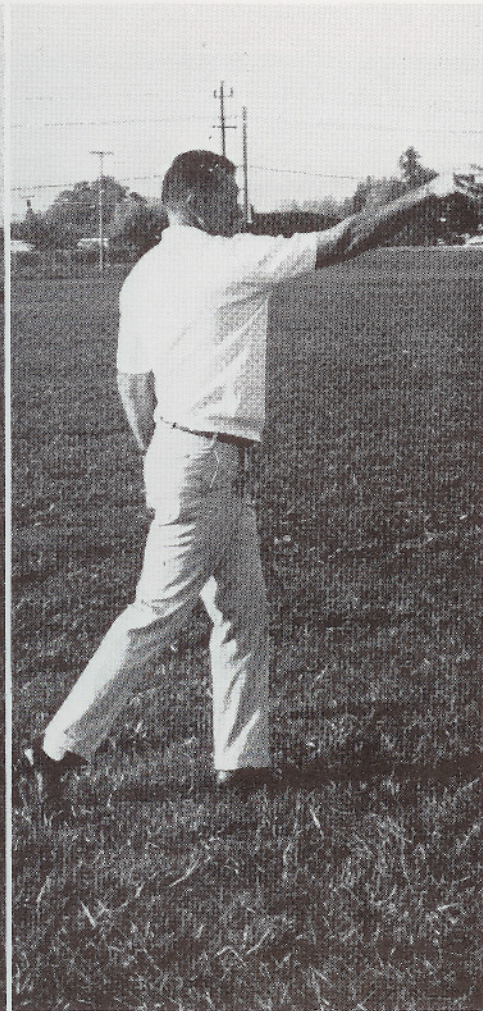
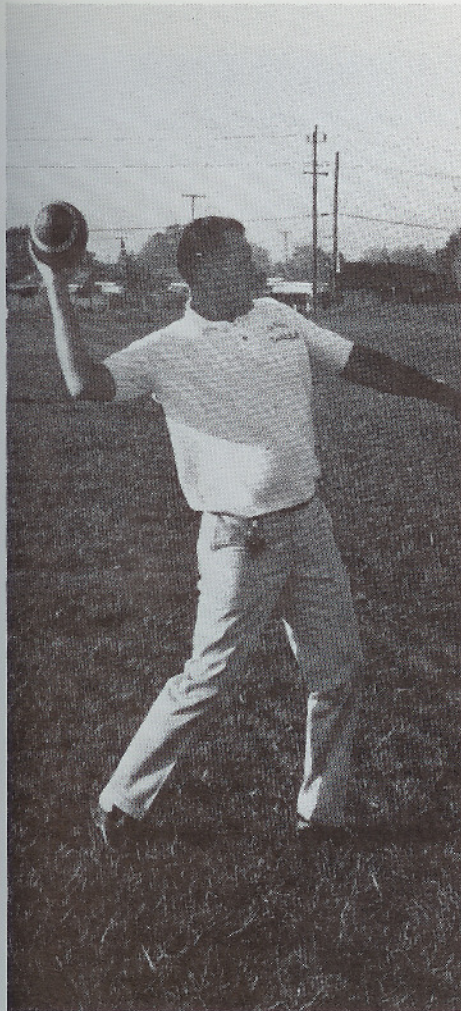
