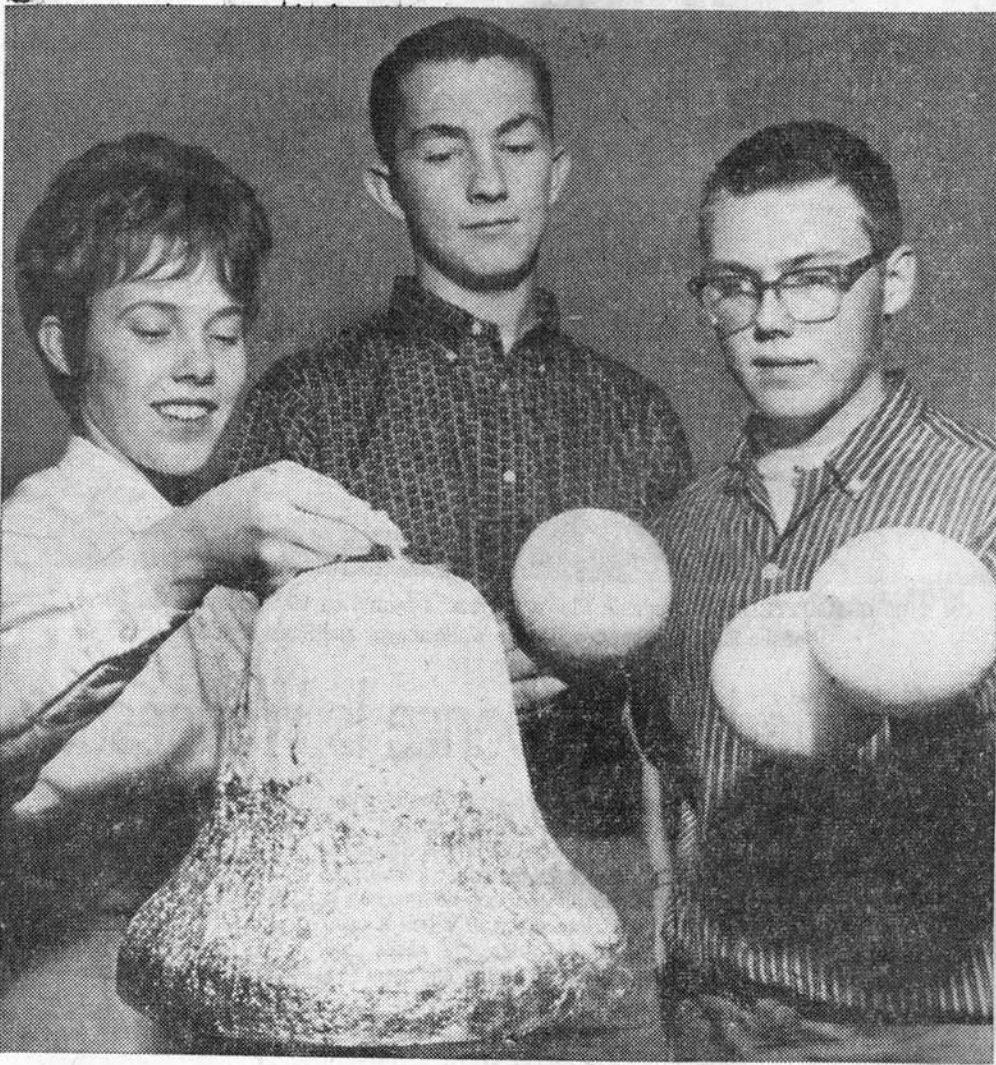
**WEDNESDAY** the drama and music departments will present the annual Christmas assembly to the student body during sixth period.
